The grand opening of the Toronto Metropolitan University School of Medicine in Brampton Centre marks a historic and inspiring milestone for our community. Our government is leading the largest expansion of medical education in more than a decade, investing nearly \$180 million to train future doctors, beginning with 176 undergraduate and postgraduate medical students for the 2025–26 school year. The TMU School of Medicine will train the next generation of health care professionals who understand both the unique challenges and the incredible strength of our diverse community. As the Minister of Women’s Social and Economic Opportunity, I am especially proud that this new school will open doors for women and underrepresented groups, who aspire to build meaningful careers in health care. Together, we are building a future where every young person can see themselves reflected in the care and compassion that keep our communities strong.



PRIMARY CARE ACTION PLAN

This year, our government launched the “Better care, closer to home” Primary Care Action Plan to strengthen Ontario’s healthcare system and ensure every person can connect to a family doctor or primary care team. With a historic \$2.1-billion commitment and a recent provincial investment to create and expand over 130 primary care teams, we are focused on delivering more care where people live. I’m proud that this work will bring three new primary care teams to Brampton Centre bringing more doctors, nurses and health professionals into our neighbourhoods. These teams will make it easier for residents to get timely, connected primary care close to home, and they will help reduce pressure on emergency departments. Together, we are building a healthcare system that works for Brampton Centre, so every family can get the care they need when they need it. These sites are:

ICIP TRANSIT ANNOUNCEMENT

Our government is thrilled to announce that riders of Brampton Transit will soon be travelling in style, as up to 136 new buses are set to enter service. This transformative investment, totaling more than \$183 million, comes through a partnership between the Government of Canada, the Government of Ontario, and the City of Brampton, and will enhance local transit capacity, safety, and the overall rider experience. The fleet will include a variety of vehicles, from 60-foot articulated buses to zero emission battery electric and hydrogen fuel cell models, helping Brampton meet the growing demand for public transit. This landmark investment is another step toward ensuring our community has the modern and reliable transit service it deserves.



SENIORS’ GRANT PROGRAM

The Seniors Community Grant Program helps local non-for-profit community groups and organizations deliver projects, supports and resources that enable older adults to live independently, with safety and security, stay connected to their community and avoid social isolation. Grants range from \$1,000 to \$25,000 and the deadline to apply is **December 18th at 5 p.m. EST**. Visit www.ontario.ca/seniorsgrant to apply.

COMMUNITY SAFETY & POLICING GRANT PROGRAM

I am proud to share that our provincial government, through the Community Safety and Policing Grant Program, is investing millions to strengthen public safety in Brampton Centre and across Ontario. The program provides support to police services for local priority initiatives such as gang prevention, mental health crisis response, hate crime units and community intervention teams, giving our officers and partners the tools they need when and where they are needed most. Our government has committed more than \$7 million in Peel and will continue to expand and fund these efforts so every resident can live with greater peace of mind.



IPV ENDEMIC

On November 5th, I successfully moved the motion in the Legislature to recognize Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) as an endemic in Ontario, joining my fellow Members of Provincial Parliament in its unanimous affirmation. This was a decisive moment in our province's history, demonstrating our government's commitment to taking collective responsibility to end the longstanding, continuous cycle of gender-based violence.

Through the Ontario STAND (Strategy to Address, Navigate, and Disrupt gender-based violence), we are investing more than \$4 billion in prevention, survivor support, and measures that hold abusers accountable.

Right here in Brampton Centre, we will see this work transform our community. Approximately \$4 million has been invested into the Safe Centre of Peel to ensure families facing crisis have faster, more accessible pathways to support. We are also strengthening victim services across the region, including more than \$2 million dedicated to expanding emergency supports in Peel so that women can find refuge and resources when they need them most.

I will continue to champion survivor-centred policies that build a system acknowledging victims of both the present and the past and ensures that no woman ever has to choose between her safety and her financial security.

Ontario is moving forward together: focused, united, and unwavering in our commitment to ensuring every woman and child in our province can live free from violence and fear. This legislation marks not an end, but the beginning of a strengthened, province-wide movement for safety and healing.

Because when women succeed, Ontario succeeds'.
